CSI: Senior High expanded to include two schools

A popular EPS/Edmonton Catholic Schools program will now be available at two high schools this year.

Starting on Monday, about 65 Grade 11 and 12 students at Archbishop O'Leary High School will be taking part in CSI: Senior High. It's the second year Archbishop O'Leary High School has offered the program, which is part of an on-going pilot project. Then later in the week, about 30 students at Austin O'Brien High School will get their first taste of the program that is designed to help youth maintain and promote healthy lifestyles.

The program complements the Forensics 25 course already being taught at the schools and uses the expertise of EPS officers in delivering strong messages on issues such as gangs, drugs and healthy relationships.

The media is invited to attend the opening session at Archbishop O'Leary High School on Monday morning (September 27) starting at 10:00. Constable Alex Hasham from the EPS and Lori Nagy from Edmonton Catholic Schools will be on hand to talk with the media. The first class will begin at 10:35.
