



School to Reopen Friday

Archbishop MacDonald High School will reopen tomorrow morning following the discovery of a threatening message that cancelled classes and closed the school today.

On May 9th, the administration was made aware of a message written in a public location of the school that threatened the safety of the school community.

“We are confident that the school remains a safe environment for students and staff and look forward to having our students return tomorrow,” said Principal Bill Myskiw.

Several supports will be in place as students return to classes Friday:

- The District’s Critical Response Team will be at the school to answer any student concerns,
- A School Resource Officer from the Edmonton Police Service will also be at the school to provide support to both staff and students;
- The school’s doors will be locked with limited access to the school,
- The number of teacher supervisors in and around the building will be increased, and
- Over a dozen school security cameras will continue monitoring the activities throughout the building.

“We would like to thank all parents and students for their support following today’s closure of the school,” Principal Myskiw said. “The safety of students and staff is always our number one priority.” Principal Myskiw went on to say.
