



Edmonton Catholic Separate School District No. 7 recognizes the rights of parents to educate their children at home. The district accepts the responsibility to facilitate, monitor and evaluate the progress of students in home education programs in accordance with Edmonton Catholic Separate School District No. 7 policies and regulations, Alberta Education Home Education Regulations, and the School Act.

Definitions:

Blended program means an education program where a teacher employed by Edmonton Catholic Separate School District No. 7 is responsible for providing for the delivery and evaluation of part of the education program.

A **home education program** is a program provided by a parent of a student that meets all of the requirements of the Home Education Regulations and is under the supervision of a school in Edmonton Catholic Separate School District No. 7. The program may be

- the *Alberta Program of Study* accessed through the Alberta Distance Learning Centre; or
- the *Alberta Program of Study* not accessed through the Alberta Distance Learning Centre; or
- other programs or courses which are consistent with Sections 2(1) and 2(3) of the *Ministerial Order No. 004/98. (Basic Education in Alberta and Student Learning Outcomes as found in the Guide to Education.)*


Home Education Regulation A.R. 126/99 Notification Form means the form prescribed in Alberta Regulation 126/99. A copy of the form is found in the Forms Section of this manual.
