




Provision of any Privately Funded Services to District Students on District Property

Administrative Regulation 316

1. No person, association, organization (or otherwise) shall enter District property for the purpose of providing a privately funded service to any District student on District property during a District school's instructional day.
2. For further clarity, the provision of any privately funded service to District students on District property outside of a District school's instructional day is permissible on the basis that the privately funded service provider shall:
 - a. act in accordance with the terms of this Policy and Administrative Regulation;
 - b. have the written permission of the school principal, who shall act in accordance with this Policy and Administrative Regulation;
 - c. have the written permission of the student's parent regarding the provision of the privately funded service;
 - d. act in accordance with the Surplus Space Administrative Policy and Regulation 604; and
 - e. act in accordance with the Provision of a Privately Funded Service Agreement drafted by the District.
3.
 - a. A District employee *may* attend a meeting or otherwise with a person, association, organization (or otherwise) which provides a privately funded service to a District student on District property in accordance with this Policy and Administrative Regulation;
 - b. Said attendance/participation is at the *sole discretion* of the District employee (not the school principal) as there is no obligation on the District employee to attend said meeting.
4. If a school principal or designate is approached by any person, association, organization (or otherwise) and the school principal provides written permission for the privately funded service to take place in accordance with this Policy and Regulation:
 - a. the school principal shall fill out the Provision of a Privately Funded Service Form and send a copy of this form to School Operation Services for information purposes prior to the commencement of said service; and
 - b. if the service relates to any District special education student program, the school principal shall provide a copy of the Provision of Privately Funded Service Form to the Assistant Superintendent of Learning Support Services for information purposes prior to the commencement of said service.
5. In the event of a conflict between the lease agreement as per Surplus Space Administrative Regulation 604 and the Provision of a Privately Funded Service Agreement, the latter supersedes.
