Background:

The Canadian Parents for French (Alberta & NWT) branch presents annual French as a Second Language(FSL) and French Immersion (FI) Education Awards to recognize outstanding contributors to French language education in Alberta. The French Immersion Professional of the Year Award honours educational assistants, language monitors, librarians and other support staff.

Ahmed Seif has made an exceptional contribution to French Immersion and FSL programming through his leadership as French Cultural Coordinator for Edmonton Catholic Schools. He has significantly expanded access to authentic francophone cultural experiences by building strong partnerships and creating engaging opportunities for students and teachers across the Division. In 2025-2026 alone, he facilitated 75 cultural activities for our 12 French Immersion schools. He has created 27 cultural resources for staff and has obtained grants that have allowed students to experience French language activities of all sorts including French language concerts, interacting with francophone authors and even meeting French journalists. His work has broadened students' understanding of la francophonie and increased their enthusiasm for using French in meaningful, relevant contexts. Through his creativity, organization, and commitment, Ahmed has had a lasting impact that extends well beyond individual schools.

CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK

Edmonton Catholic Schools has been an ardent supporter of Catholic Education Sunday and Catholic Education Week since its inception. For us, Catholic Education Week is an opportunity to celebrate the distinctive mission of Catholic education and to recognize the important partnership among students, families, schools, parishes, and the wider Catholic community.

This year, Catholic Education Week is scheduled for Saturday, October 18th until Friday, October 23rd, with Catholic Education Sunday being celebrated on October 18th. While Catholic Education Week has taken many forms over the years, the Alberta Catholic Schools Trustees Association (ACSTA) and the Council of Catholic School Superintendents of Alberta (CCSSA) currently lead its development.

This year, the theme: "The Power of the Holy Spirit," is inspired by Romans 15:13: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Saint Pier Giorgio will also be featured as part of Catholic Education Week. Pier Giorgio Frassati was an Italian Catholic activist and a member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic. He was dedicated to social justice issues and joined several charitable organizations, including Catholic Action and the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, to better aid the poor and less fortunate living in his hometown of Turin. Pope John Paul II beatified Frassati in May of 1990 and dubbed him the "Man of the Eight Beatitudes." On September 7, 2025, Pope Leo XIV canonized Frassati along with Carlo Acutis.



The example of Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati reminds us that authentic faith is lived through service. As you heard during our School Opening Meeting for Division Leadership, Service is one of the 5 roots of Joy that we will intentionally explore at our sites

throughout the school year. Many schools choose to incorporate activities rooted in Catholic Social Teaching during Catholic Education Week. These may include charitable initiatives, outreach projects, fundraising campaigns, environmental stewardship activities, social justice projects, or acts of service that respond to local community needs. Such experiences help students understand that their faith

calls them to love their neighbor, serve the vulnerable, and work toward the common good. Through these acts of service, students encounter Christ in others and learn that Catholic education extends beyond the classroom into the wider world.

The master template for Catholic Education Week, including the bishop's letter, a liturgy, and some ideas and activities for schools, will be shared in the coming weeks. The CCSSA will also unveil a new logo created exclusively for Catholic Education Week.

CELEBRATING THE GIFT OF CATHOLIC EDUCATION

At its core, Catholic Education Week is an opportunity to give thanks for the gift of publicly funded Catholic education in Alberta. Throughout the week, students, staff, trustees, clergy, parents, parishioners, and community members are invited to reflect on the unique role Catholic schools play in forming young people academically, spiritually, socially, emotionally, and morally. Catholic schools remain places where faith and learning are intentionally integrated, helping students grow in wisdom, virtue, compassion, and faith while preparing them to contribute meaningfully to society. Catholic Education Week provides an opportunity to celebrate this mission and to recognize the countless individuals whose efforts help sustain and strengthen Catholic education throughout our province.



One of the most meaningful ways this celebration is expressed is through prayer and worship. Prayer remains central to Catholic Education Week, and schools across the province traditionally gather as communities of faith to celebrate liturgies, Masses, prayer services, and reflections rooted in the annual theme and accompanying scripture passage. These celebrations provide opportunities for students and staff to encounter Christ through prayer, proclaim the Gospel, and give thanks for the blessings of Catholic education. Provincial resources often include liturgical celebrations, prayers of the faithful, classroom reflections, and prayer experiences that schools can adapt to their own local contexts. Through these gatherings, Catholic schools demonstrate that faith is not simply taught in the classroom but is lived, celebrated, and witnessed through the daily life of the community.

This emphasis on prayer and faith formation helps remind us that Catholic education is more than an educational model; its shared mission of education, evangelization and discipleship remains one of the Board's priorities. Our shared missions seeks to form young people in mind, body, and spirit as they grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ and their commitment to serving others.

LIVING THE SCHOOL-HOME-PARISH PARTNERSHIP

One of the defining characteristics of Catholic Education Week is the opportunity to strengthen the relationship among schools, families, and parish communities. Edmonton Catholic Schools has long recognized that the faith formation of children and youth is most effective when school, home, and parish work together in a shared mission. During Catholic Education Week, schools may invite parish priests, pastoral assistants, trustees, and families to participate in prayer services, liturgical celebrations, faith-based learning opportunities, and community gatherings. These activities celebrate the important role each partner plays in supporting students as they grow in their relationship with Christ and become active members of the Church.

Within this partnership, students themselves are at the center. Catholic Education Week provides meaningful opportunities for young people to share their faith through leadership, service, creativity, and witness. Schools may invite students to lead prayers, proclaim Scripture, share reflections, create artwork, produce videos, participate in liturgies, or speak about the impact of Catholic education on their lives. These experiences not only highlight student voice but also demonstrate the ways in which faith is nurtured through the collective efforts of families, parish communities, and schools working together.

By creating opportunities for students to actively participate in the life of the faith community, Catholic Education Week reminds us that students are not merely recipients of Catholic education but active participants in the mission of the Church. This year's focus on Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati provides a particularly meaningful example of youthful discipleship, joyful faith, and courageous service. His witness invites students to embrace their own call to holiness, leadership, and service while recognizing the important role they play in bringing the Gospel to life within their schools, parishes, and wider communities.

CATHOLIC EDUCATION SUNDAY AND OUR CATHOLIC COMMUNITIES

Catholic Education Sunday traditionally serves as the opening celebration of Catholic Education Week and provides a unique opportunity to strengthen relationships between schools and parish communities. Schools may participate in parish liturgies through student involvement, choir ministry, hospitality, parish displays, bulletin inserts, faith witness presentations, or opportunities to share the story of Catholic education with parishioners. These celebrations make visible the close connection between parish and school and remind us that Catholic education remains an important ministry of the

Church, supported by the collective efforts of families, educators, clergy, trustees, and parish communities.

Building upon these parish connections, Catholic Education Week also provides opportunities to celebrate the broader Catholic community that supports our schools. Many schools choose to open their doors to parents, grandparents, trustees, parish representatives, alumni, and community members through open houses, learning showcases, faith fairs, classroom visits, student performances, prayer gatherings, and family events. These celebrations offer opportunities for guests to witness firsthand the learning, faith development, and sense of belonging that characterize Catholic schools throughout Edmonton Catholic Schools. They also serve as a reminder that Catholic education flourishes through the support, engagement, and shared commitment of the entire faith community.

To support these local celebrations, schools receive resources developed collaboratively by the Alberta Catholic School Trustees' Association (ACSTA), the Council of Catholic School Superintendents of Alberta (CCSSA), the Alberta Bishops, and Catholic school jurisdictions across the province. These resources often include lesson ideas, liturgical materials, classroom activities, prayer services, reflections, and communication supports designed to bring the annual theme to life. In addition, Edmonton Catholic Schools' Religious Education Services team continues to work alongside schools to adapt provincial resources to local school and parish contexts while ensuring that Catholic Education Week remains focused on faith formation, community engagement, and celebrating the enduring gift of Catholic education.



LOOKING AHEAD TO CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK

As details continue to emerge from the Provincial Catholic Education Week Committee, schools may wish to begin considering how they will celebrate this important week within their local context. Opportunities to gather in prayer, celebrate the Eucharist, engage students in faith-filled activities, serve others, welcome families into the life of the school, and strengthen relationships with parish communities all contribute to making Catholic education visible and vibrant. While the specific theme resources are still forthcoming, Catholic Education Week remains an opportunity to celebrate the many ways faith is lived, shared, and nurtured within our schools and communities.

At its heart, Catholic Education Week is a celebration of Jesus Christ and the mission of Catholic education. It invites us to reflect on our shared responsibility to form students who are grounded in faith, committed to serving others, and prepared to contribute to the common good. Through prayer, liturgy, Scripture, faith-filled learning, service, and meaningful engagement with families and parishes, Catholic schools continue to witness to the Gospel and strengthen the partnership between school, home, and parish. Additional resources, including the annual pastoral letter from the Alberta Bishops, are anticipated and will provide further reflection and encouragement as schools prepare to celebrate this important week.

We are looking forward to celebrating Catholic Education Week together and giving thanks for the enduring gift of Catholic education.

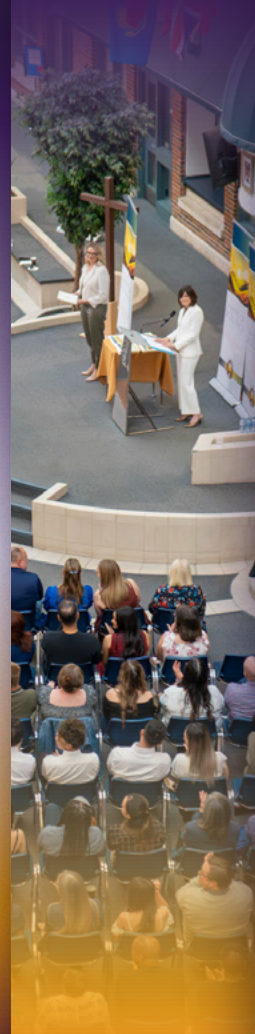

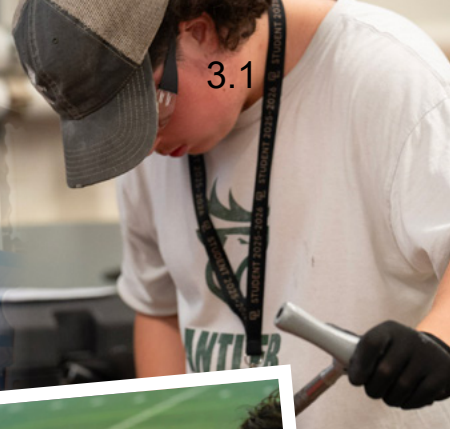

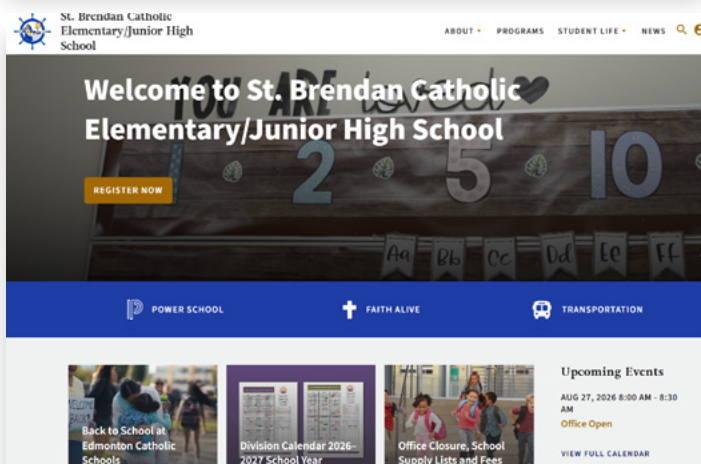

Open Houses: Helping Families Explore Their Options

Open Houses are among the Division's most important enrolment and family engagement opportunities. While families experience Open Houses as a single event, significant planning and coordination take place throughout the year to ensure schools can effectively connect with prospective families and showcase the value of Catholic education.

Families only attend an Open House if they know it exists. Communications helps schools reach prospective families through coordinated marketing, advertising, social media, websites, photography, video, and school-specific promotional support.

To help schools reach prospective families, Communications develops and implements Division-wide campaigns using multiple communication channels, including:

- Digital advertising
- Community and neighbourhood advertising
- Website promotion
- Social media campaigns
- Open House branding and promotional materials
- Registration messaging

Find Your Open House



A centralized Open House webpage on ecsd.net serves as the Division's primary information hub, allowing families to access school dates, times, websites, registration information, transportation resources, programs and options information, and the School Finder tool from one location. This approach creates a consistent, accessible experience for families and helps ensure information is easy to find.



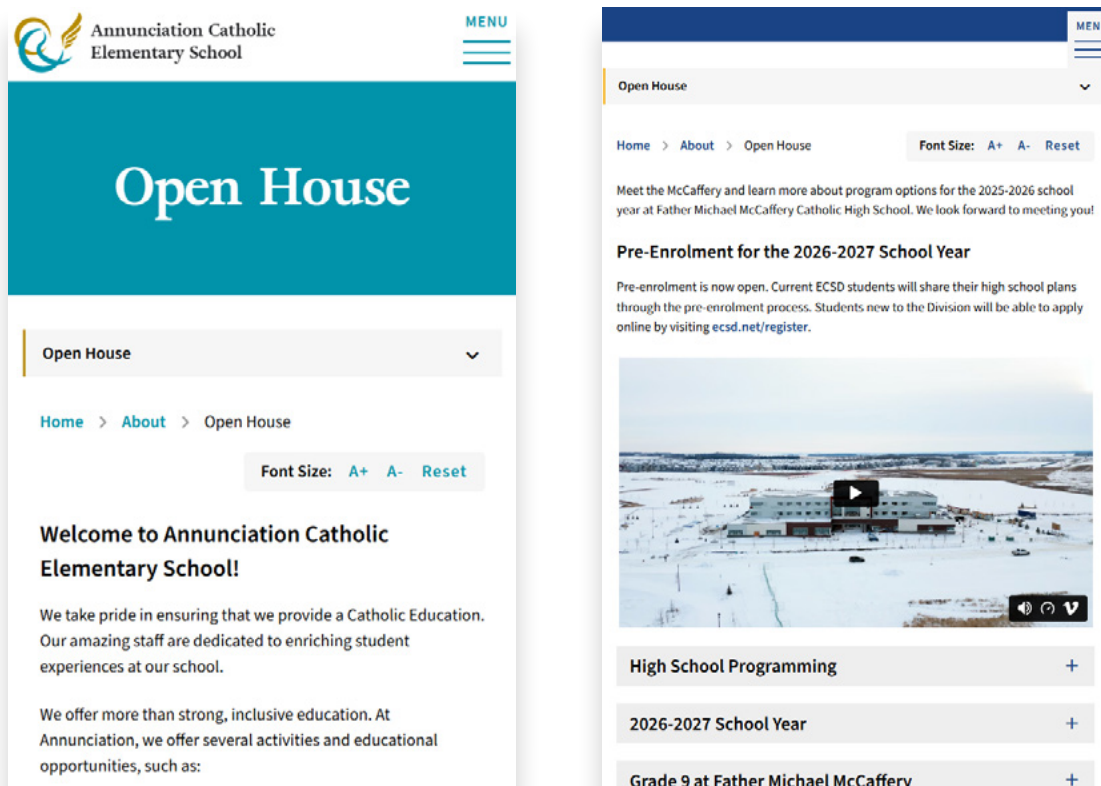

SUPPORTING SCHOOLS ONLINE: OPEN HOUSE WEB STRATEGY

Supporting Schools Online: Open House Web Strategy



When families begin searching for a school, the website is often the first place they go and one of the last places they return to before making a decision. For many schools, that digital first impression is shaped by the support and guidance they receive from Communications.

Planning for the Open House web season begins in the spring of the previous school year. After each cycle, Communications reviews website traffic, messaging effectiveness, and school participation to identify what worked and what needs to improve. That review shapes the tools, templates, and training developed for the year ahead.

Templates are one of the most practical supports Communications provides. Web delegates are often administrators, teachers, or support staff managing website responsibilities alongside other duties. Templates give schools a professional, ready-to-use starting point that meets Division standards, follows accessibility guidelines, and uses language that is clear for families. Schools can personalize the content to reflect their community without having to start from scratch or worry about whether key information is accurate and consistent.

Approximately 75% of school web delegates utilized Open House resources and templates developed by Communications.

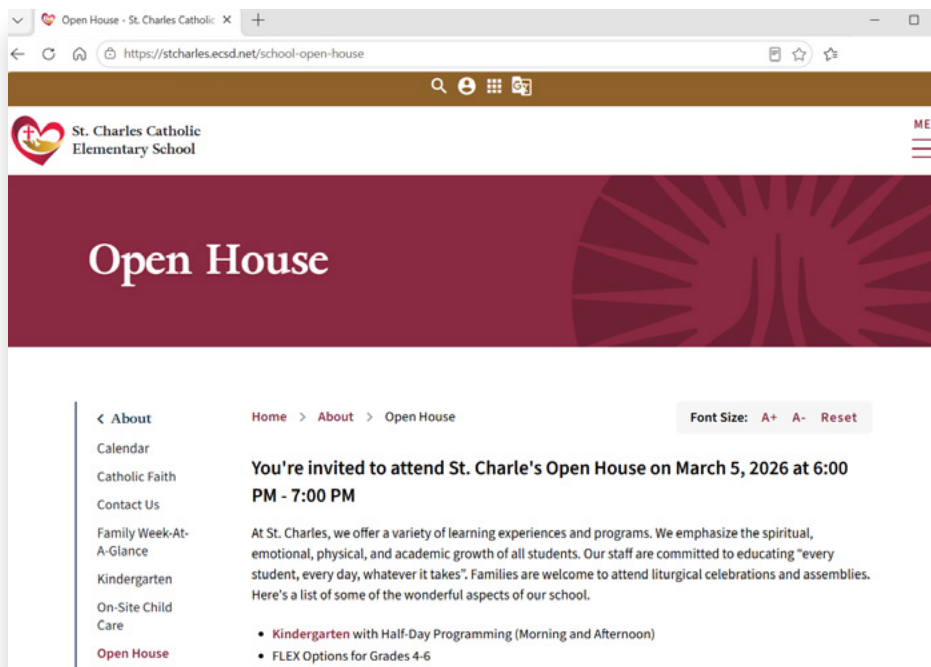
One-on-one support takes that work further. When Communications works directly with a school, the conversation goes beyond the website. It is an opportunity to understand what makes that school community distinct, identify gaps in how the school is communicating with prospective families, and develop content that reflects its strengths. Schools that have received direct support have come away with stronger pages, clearer messaging, and a better understanding of how their website fits into the Division's broader enrolment strategy.

Across the Division, this work has helped to:

- Improve website usability
- Enhance accessibility
- Increase the visibility of key information
- Identify and share best practices
- Strengthen school-level communications and marketing efforts

Division promotional efforts, including advertising, social media, and community outreach, direct families back to school websites.

Families are using the Open House web content as a key source of information during the school decision-making process. It also reinforces the importance of continued support for school websites as part of the Division's enrolment and communications strategy.



SUPPORTING SCHOOL RECRUITMENT AND AWARENESS

Supporting School Recruitment and Awareness

While Division-wide campaigns help raise awareness of Edmonton Catholic Schools, Communications also works directly with schools to help them reach families in their local communities and achieve specific goals.

These goals may include:

- promoting a new program
- increasing awareness of a specialized offering
- strengthening community engagement
- supporting student recruitment
- highlighting opportunities available within their school community

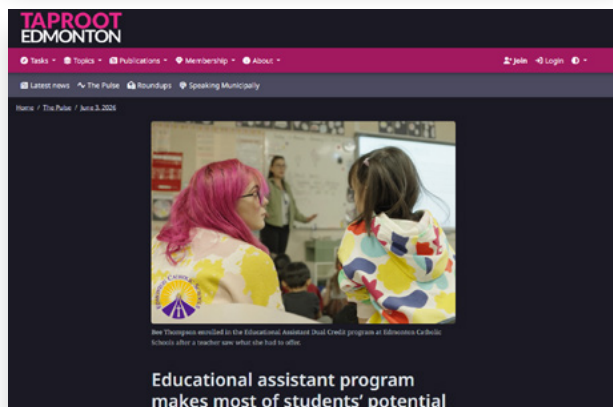
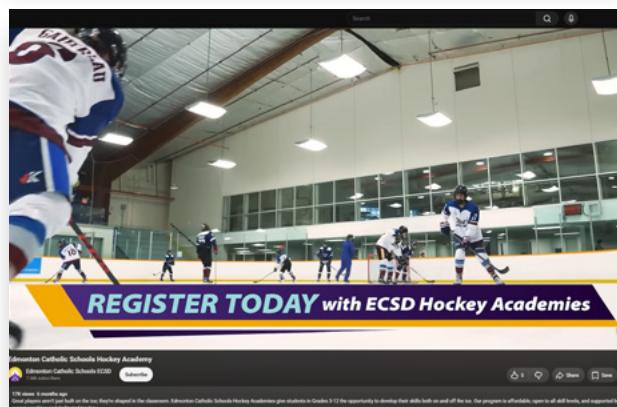
During the 2025–2026 Open House cycle, Communications worked directly with approximately 85 schools with a marketing plan.

Our team of specialists works with school principals and departments to understand their goals and concerns. After that initial meeting, our specialists develop a comprehensive multi-platform communication and marketing strategy tailored to their needs. Whether it's student recruitment, promotional opportunities, community engagement, or program awareness, every strategy is designed to strengthen engagement with ECSD and prospective families.

Spotlight: Father Michael Troy Catholic Junior High School



When Father Michael Troy Catholic Junior High School introduced a new STEM program, Communications partnered with school administration to build awareness of the new opportunity and support the school's growth objectives.

Communications developed a comprehensive communications and marketing strategy that included a refreshed school brand, key messaging, website enhancements, promotional materials, social media support, and media relations opportunities. Together, these efforts helped communicate the school's unique learning opportunities and create greater awareness among prospective families.

By sharing a consistent message across multiple channels, Communications helped strengthen the school's profile within the community and support informed enrolment decisions. On top of promotion, the goal is ensuring families have the information they need to make informed decisions about their child's education.

EMPOWERING SCHOOLS TO TELL THEIR STORY

Empowering Schools to Tell Their Story

Every ECSD school has a unique story to tell. While schools share a common Catholic mission, each school community reflects the students, families, traditions, learning opportunities, and faith experiences that make it distinct. Families exploring schools want more than a list of programs and services. They want to understand what life is like within a particular school community and whether it is the right fit for their child.

The most authentic stories often come directly from the people living them every day. Principals, staff, students, and families are closest to the experiences that shape school culture, celebrate student success, and bring faith to life. For this reason, Communications focuses on empowering schools to tell their own stories.

Communications provides resources, guidance, training, best practices, website support, and strategic communications advice that help schools communicate effectively with current and prospective families.

By equipping school leaders and web delegates with tools and support, Communications helps build school-level capacity while promoting consistency, accessibility, and alignment with Division priorities.

At the same time, some stories deserve a broader audience. When a story reflects Division priorities, highlights innovative practices, showcases student achievement, demonstrates the impact of Catholic education, or may be of interest to families across the Division, Communications may share it through Division channels. This Division-wide lens helps amplify stories that illustrate the mission, values, and strengths shared across Edmonton Catholic Schools.

Together, school-based and Division-wide storytelling help families understand both the unique character of individual schools and the broader community they become part of when they choose Edmonton Catholic Schools. This balance of local authenticity and Division-wide consistency helps families make informed decisions and builds confidence in Catholic education.

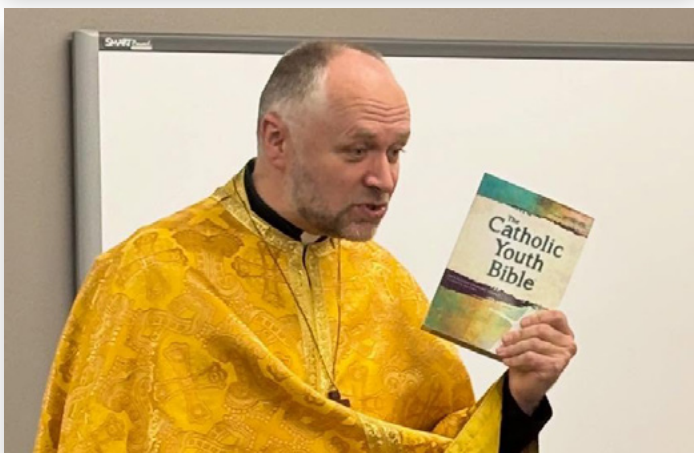
One of Communications' most important responsibilities is helping families understand what makes Catholic education distinct.

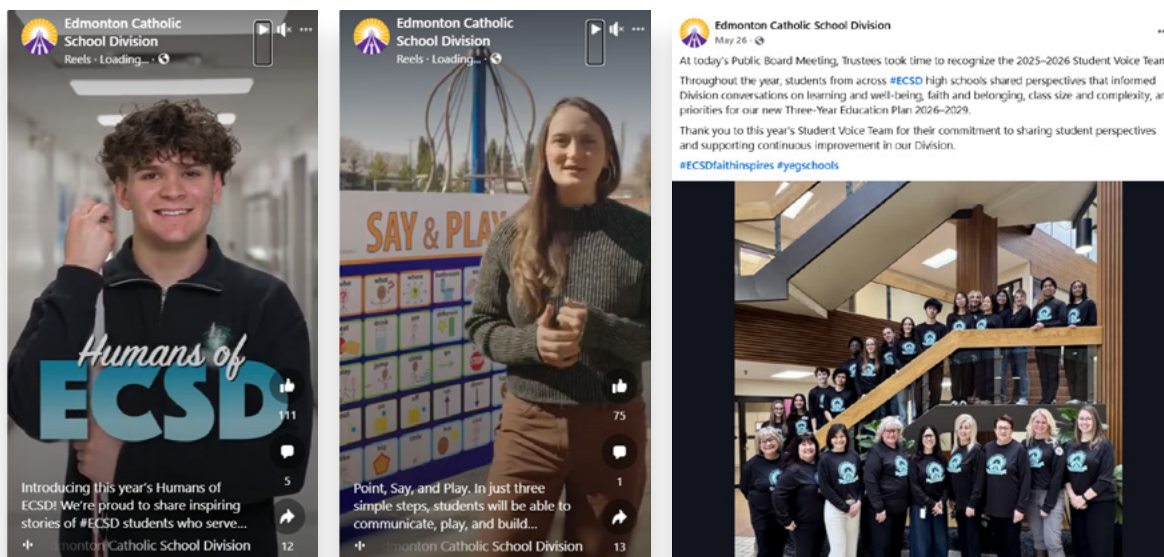


GROWING PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT THROUGH SOCIAL MEDIA

It's also one of the Division's primary channels for promoting Open Houses, registration, programs, school celebrations, and Division initiatives. Our social media content strategy focuses on storytelling that highlights what makes an Edmonton Catholic Schools education unique.



Social Media Growth and Impact

Data from the 2025-2026 school year points to a growing and engaged audience. Families are finding ECSD content, engaging with it, and choosing to learn more. Link clicks are worth watching closely because they signal intent, not just reach. A view means someone saw the content. A click means they wanted to know more, whether that is a school website, a program page, or awareness about an upcoming Open House. The Find Your Open House Campaign extended the Division's reach well beyond what traditional advertising channels can achieve at comparable cost.

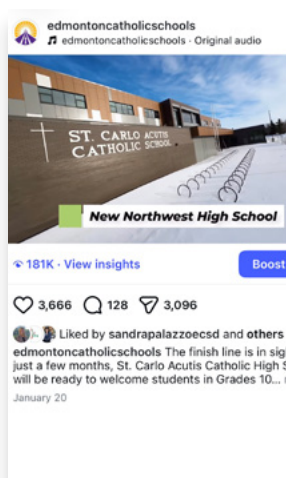

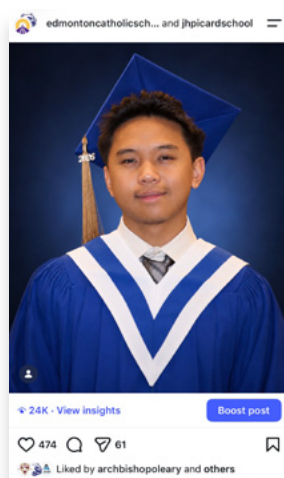

Background:

The 2026-2027 school year brings new journeys for Edmonton Catholic Schools. Our Division theme for the year, *Rooted in Joy*, will see our schools exploring how the foundation of our faith, God's great love for us, nurtures the deep roots of a life of joy for all. This new school year also brings a new [Three-year Education Plan 2026-2029](#) to guide our growth and improvement. The goals of this plan are grounded in creating the conditions for optimal learning for all students and are brought into focus through the Division Priorities of *Learning and Living Our Faith*, *Nurturing Student Well-being*, and *Excellent Learning Experiences*. I wish to highlight some of my activities as Chief Superintendent alongside some of the happenings in our Division as they relate to the framework of our Division Priorities.

Learning And Living Our Faith

- At the start of each school year, our staff is blessed to gather in celebration of the Eucharist and to recommit ourselves to the vocation of Catholic education. We are privileged to live out our Catholic faith in every aspect of our work, beginning with nurturing our relationship with Jesus. School opening Mass was held in eight locations across the city, and through the generosity of our staff, we raised just over \$11,000 to be shared between the Sign of Hope and The Edmonton Catholic Schools Foundation.
- Worship is a focal point for establishing the roots of faith for our students. Through daily prayer, liturgical celebrations, and Mass, our students have the opportunity to reflect on all of the goodness in their lives, the gifts of our Father, and to respond with thanksgiving and praise. This, in turn, empowers them to be witnesses of God's goodness beyond their schools. Our [school communities began the school year](#) with worshipful gratitude, purpose, and joy.

Nurturing Student Well-being

- A playground is so important to nurturing student well-being. It supports physical well-being, but there is also much social-emotional learning that takes place through play. I was pleased to send greetings for the blessing and grand opening of the St. Pius X Catholic Elementary School Playground, which was rebuilt after being lost to a fire last year. There was much joy to be experienced that evening.

- Our Division is hosting our Newcomer Information Evening again this year. This event is a great opportunity for families who are new to Canada to learn more about Edmonton Catholic Schools and the supports available. They will receive information on Intercultural Services , Community Partnerships, School Procedures, PowerSchool, Busing, and Resources for English Language Learners. Community partners will share resources and parents can attend breakout sessions with Intercultural Liaisons on topics critical for new families to integrate into schools - available in 10 languages: Amharic, Arabic, Chinese, English, Filipino/Tagalog, French, Spanish, Tigrinya, Ukrainian, and Vietnamese.
- Elementary students from across the Division participated in the 36th annual ECSD Cross Country Run. This two-day event saw 2700 students in grades 3-6 from 62 schools engaging in 1200 m (age 8 and under) and 2000m runs. There was much joy and fun had by all.
- Many of our schools will participate in the Terry Fox run. This annual event creates a wonderful opportunity for students to engage in service learning and well-being as they raise vital funds for cancer research.

Excellent Learning Experiences

- It was a very busy summer for Alternative Education as they have served our summer school students. Summer School remains an extremely important support for students in the completion of their high school requirements. Courses offered this year include: Religion 15, 25, 35, Religions of the World 35; CALM 20; CALM 20/Physical Education 10 Combination; Physical Education 10 (3 credit); Aboriginal Studies 10 and 30; English 10-1, 10-2, 20-1, 20-2, 30-1, and 30-2; Social Studies 10-1,10-2, 20-1, 20-2, 30-1, and 30-2; Math 10-3, 10C, 20-1, 20-2, 20-3 , 30-1, 30-2, and 30-3; Science 10, 14, 20, 24 , and 30; Chemistry 20 and 30; Biology 20 and 30; Physics 20 and 30. We also offered English as an Additional Language summer programs, and for Dual Credit, we offered Fundamental Kitchen Skills and Trade Calculations (NAIT), Health Care Aide (Norquest), and Policing in Canada (MacEwan University). Over 4100 students were served through these learning opportunities.
- Students will engage in age-appropriate learning experiences as we observe Orange Shirt Day and The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Our Indigenous Learning Services team has compiled resources to support staff in ensuring that learning about the painful history and legacy of residential schools is approached with sensitivity and care.
