The Board of Trustees held a Special Public Meeting on May 29 to announce that Lynnette Anderson, who currently serves the Division as Superintendent of Learning Services, will assume the role of Chief Superintendent as of August 1, 2023. At their May 31 Regular Public Meeting, the Board of Trustees approved the Edmonton Catholic Schools' 2023-2024 Division Operating Budget. The Division's budget for 2023-2024 is forecasting total revenues of \$555.8 million and expenditures of \$567.4 million, resulting in a \$11.6 million Operating Deficit. Our Indigenous Learning Services Department has created a bank of resources to support our schools in honouring the history, heritage, and diversity of Indigenous peoples in Canada. Father's Day falls on June 18. It is a time for us to turn our eyes to St. Joseph, who humbly embraced his call to be the earthly father for Jesus, the Son of God. Let us pray together for his intercession, support, and guidance for all the men who embrace the role of father, grandfather, uncle, mentor, and so many more in the lives of our children.

I leave you with humble thanks for the gifts of heart and spirit that I have received in living out our mission to provide a Catholic education that inspires students to learn and that prepares them to live fully and to serve God in one another. I look forward to following the bright future that is ahead for our Division.
