

ALBERTA BLUE CROSS ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

FOR INDIGENOUS STUDENTS

Alberta Blue Cross has established three awards for Indigenous students who are completing their high school education and entering their first year of postsecondary study at an accredited institution.


These scholarships are based primarily on community involvement, personal goals, and financial need. Scholastic achievement will also be considered. The amount of the award varies according to the institution the student will be attending.

Value of awards: Alberta Blue Cross issues three awards each year. Awards range from \$750 to \$1,500.

Eligibility

- Applicants are a First Nation Band Member, or have Inuit, Métis or Indian Status as referenced on the Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada website.
- Applicants must be enrolled in the first year of any full-time postsecondary certificate or diploma program of two or more years duration.
- Applicants must clearly describe their community involvement, personal goals, and financial need.
- Applicants must have been residents of Alberta during their most recent year of study.
- Applicants must submit three reference letters for evaluation.







Application opens September 1st and closes January 31st

ADVANCING FUTURES BURSARY

FOR INDIGENOUS STUDENTS

Advancing Futures Bursary is a post-secondary bursary program for current and former youth in government care aged 18-24. The program provides social and emotional supports and funding to eligible students while they pursue postsecondary studies, such as:

- Obtaining their high school equivalency through adult education;
- Earning a degree/diploma from a post- secondary school;
- · Learning a trade;
- Earning a license or certificate.

Eligibility

- Be between 18-24 years old at the time they apply
- Be a full- or part-time student enrolled at an approved institution, and
- · Have been a youth in government care as a result of an Alberta-based agreement or order
- They must also have:
- Had a Permanent Guardianship Order (PGO) between the time they were 13 and 18 years old, OR
- Been in the care or custody of Alberta Human Services for at least 546 days (18 months) between the time they were 13 and 24 years old.

Step 2. Apply to a program

Students must have applied to their program of study before applying to Advancing
Futures. Students do not need to have been accepted into their program of study to
apply to Advancing Futures. Proof of application to or enrolment in the intended
program of study must be submitted when applying to Advancing Futures.

Step 3. Complete the application

• Use the application form on the website and include a copy of proof of applying to a program of study.

Note: Applications will not be considered unless accompanied by proof of application, conditional acceptance, acceptance or enrolment (issued by the institution).

INDIGENOUS EDUCATION AWARDS

Our Indigenous Education Awards Program supports First Nation, Inuit, and Métis students across Canada by providing financial assistance to help them in their quest for higher education. These awards, bursaries and scholarships are given to students who demonstrate leadership capabilities and strive to be role models in their schools and communities.

ATCO

There are three different awards available:

- Merit Awards (\$500) for students completing Grades 10 12, including upgrading
- Bursaries (\$1,000) for students enrolled in trade, diploma, or certificate programs
- Scholarships (\$1,500) for students enrolled in degree or graduate programs.
- Bridging Awards (\$1,000) for students registered in an upgrading program or University Preparation program

*There is a maximum of one award per applicant per year. Students must reapply each year if they wish to be considered.

Eligibility


You can apply if you are:

- Are a Canadian Indigenous person;
- Are enrolled full-time in high school (including upgrading) or an accredited post-secondary institution or training program;
- Are not the child of an ATCO employee.

Deadline to Apply:

Application opens
March 2024 and closes
August 2024

How to Apply



- Complete the online application form.
- Submit the following required documentation:
- One reference letter from a teacher, community leader or employer;
- Short essay (500 1,000 words) describing why you are a suitable candidate;
- Proof of enrollment for the upcoming school semester (can include acceptance letter, class schedule or receipt of paid fees);
- Transcript from the most recent school attended (unofficial transcript is acceptable).

HONOURING SPIRIT SCHOLARSHIP

INDIGENOUS STUDENT AWARDS

This award recognizes First Nations, Metis, and Inuit students who model strength and commitment in the pursuit of their personal education paths and embrace their own gifts, strengths and potential while celebrating the ways of their people.

These awards provide the opportunity to celebrate the unique qualities of students who inspire their peers, teachers, education leaders and community members while respecting the agency of other students to do the same in their own ways.



Eligibility

- Students may be nominated by other students, teachers, principals, superintendents, education directors, trustees, school staff or a member of the education community based on their exemplary leadership, honour, courage, and commitment to their own education path.
- Identify as First Nations, Metis, and Inuit students
- Enrolled in, and regularly attend school that is operated by an ASBA member school board or First Nations Education Authority.

Documents Required

- A completed nomination form,
- A letter of nomination outlining why the nominator has chosen this student to be recognized (maximum of 3 pages),
- One additional letter of support for the nomination (maximum of 3 pages).

TD CANADA TRUST SCHOLARSHIP

FOR INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

Together with AFOA Canada, a not-for-profit led by Indigenous Peoples, we've worked to build a scholarship for Indigenous Peoples. Through it, 25 scholarships are available to be awarded annually, worth up to \$60K over 4 years. TD Scholarship for Indigenous peoples is customized to the needs of Indigenous peoples. Students from the Indigenous community face unique challenges and systemic barriers that can make getting a post-secondary education difficult. So, we worked closely with AFOA Canada to build a scholarship program that helps meets the unique needs of students from the Indigenous community. These scholarships are available Canada wide.



What's Included?

- \$10,000 towards tuition each year for a maximum of 4 years (if tuition is less than \$10,000 the balance can be applied towards living expenses).
- \$5000 towards living expenses each year for a maximum of 4 years
- Employment opportunities at TD. Summer employment between years of study and full-time upon graduation.

Eligibility

- Regardless of your field of study, scholarships are open to First Nations, Metis and Inuit who are members / citizen of a First Nation, Metis or Inuit community who:
- have applied for a full-time minimum 2-year program with an approved post-secondary institution for the next year of study; or
- are enrolled in, or accepted to, a full-time minimum two-year program with an approved post-secondary institution for the next year of study
- Employees of TD and its subsidiaries and their children are not eligible for these scholarships

FOR INDIGENOUS STUDENT HIGH SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT

Two (2) awards, with a value of \$1,500 each, are available to grade 12 Indigenous students who are enrolled in or accepted into a business program offered by an Alberta college, polytechnic, or university that offers the prerequisite courses required for entrance into the CPA Professional Education Program (CPA PEP).



What's Included?

Two awards valued at \$1,500 each

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- be a person who self-identifies as Indigenous (i.e. Status Indian/First Nations, Non-Status Indian/First Nations, Métis or Inuit);
- submit a letter or video (2 to 3 minutes maximum) outlining why they are planning to, or are currently pursuing, a career in business or as a professional accountant;
- submit most recent transcripts to demonstrate academic achievement; and
- submit one (1) letter of support from a current instructor.

Preference is given to students who intend to pursue a Chartered Professional Accountant designation.

THE BBMAS WERE ESTABLISHED IN 2001 by the directors of the Canative Housing Corporation, Orval Belcourt, Dr. Herb Belcourt, and Georges Brosseau QC. Their vision was to help Métis Albertans realize self-sufficiency through post-secondary education and skills development.

Over the past twenty years the Belcourt Brosseau Métis Awards have provided more than \$11 million dollars to approximately 2,000 Métis students studying at institutions across Alberta. These awards are one of the largest non-governmental sources of student funding for Métis students in Canada.



The BBMAs can support you by covering between \$1,000 and \$10,000 of your tuition and fees.

Eligibility

- Membership with the Métis Nation of Alberta or a Métis Settlement (Note: if you are in process of receiving citizenship or membership you will need to upload a letter saying you have applied for it)
- Alberta Residence and Canadian Citizenship
- Studying in an eligible program at an eligible post-secondary

Indspire's Building Brighter Futures: Bursaries, Scholarships and Awards (BBF) program opens doors through education.

Since 1996, Indspire has provided over \$217 million in financial support through more than 66,000 bursaries, scholarships and awards to First Nations, Inuit and Métis students. All Building Brighter Futures donations are matched by the Government of Canada allowing us to be double the impact for students.



What's Included?

Disbursement criteria for financial awards are negotiated with funders for significant donations (i.e. gift amounts of \$5,000 per year or more), recognizing that Indspire's goal is to make funding accessible to as many eligible applicants as possible. The disbursement of financial awards is tied to funding agreement criteria, where it can be either:

- a fixed amount, the total amount of which will be disbursed to a successful applicant(s); or
- based on (1) an assessment of the application, and (2) monies available to be disbursed.

Eligibility

- be an Indigenous person;
- be enrolled in:
 - an accredited education program; a professional development program; a continuing education program; a traditional knowledge program; or arts training; and
- not be a member of the staff, board, or jury at the time of applying for funding support .

Freehorse Family Wellness Society (FFWS) is a non-profit organization proud to administer the Post Secondary Student Support Program (PSSSP) funding on behalf of Indigenous Services Canada (ISC). This program is run in accordance with the PSSSP and University and College Entrance Preparation Program (UCEPP) guidelines and assists students who have regained their status as a result of Bill C-31 from various Alberta First Nations, as well as students who are residents of Alberta but registered with a band located in the Northwest Territories.



What's Included?

Sponsorship varies based on program. Please refer to handbook for more information.

Eligibility

Three eligibility criteria must be met by ALL applicants:

- a. Personal
- b. Educational Institution
- c. Program

(Please refer to eligibility document for full information)

*Note - Band Membership: Some Alberta First Nations have their own membership list in place. FFWS does not sponsor individuals who are on their band membership list, regardless of eligibility.



Every year, the Native Women's Association of Canada (NWAC) provides the Helen Bassett Commemorative Award to four Indigenous women, Two-Spirit, or gender-diverse students, in the amount of \$1,000 each.

The awards are made possible through generous donation by Helen Bassett, an Ontario artist and passionate advocate for the advancement of Indigenous women, as well as fair solutions to Indigenous land claim issues. She directed open letters to Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau and his cabinet in 1980 and again in 1983, proposing a tax be levied on all land transactions in Canada, with a royalty paid to Indigenous Peoples. She outlined her ideas in Native Rights. In her selflessness, she specified NWAC as one of the beneficiaries of her estate. This has helped to sustain our post-secondary student awards program to this day.
