It will also ensure that public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and legacy of residential schools remains a vital component of the reconciliation process.

At the June 23, 2021 Public Meeting of the Board, the Board of Trustees approved the 2021-2022 school year calendar, adding the new national day on Thursday, September 30.
