A total of 271 responses were received, primarily from parents/guardians with children currently enrolled in ECSD schools.

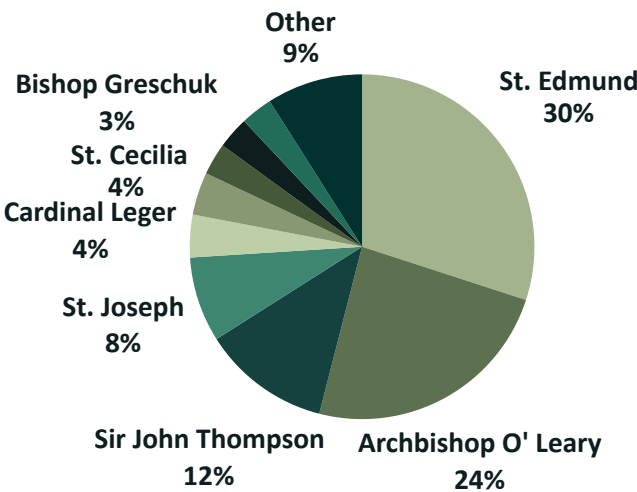

St. Carlo Acutis will open with Grade 10 and 11. If you are currently a grade 10 student living in the attendance boundary of St. Carlo Acutis and attending either St. Joseph or Archbishop O'Leary, you have the option to move to St. Carlos Acutis or stay at your existing school for 2026-2027.

120 OF RESPONDENTS LIKE THE PROPOSED ATTENDANCE BOUNDARY

Respondents were asked to provide feedback on the proposed attendance area for St. Carlos Acutis. These are the top three themes that emerged:

1. Many respondents expressed interest in clear boundaries and feeder patterns.
2. Boundary area and size concerns, proposed boundary was either too small or too large.
3. Proximity and transportation concerns for the families east of the proposed area.

NEXT STEPS

- Finalize attendance boundaries and communicate feeder school alignment.
- Review programming priorities to align with community interest.
- Continue engagement as the school opening approaches to confirm offerings and address transportation considerations.
