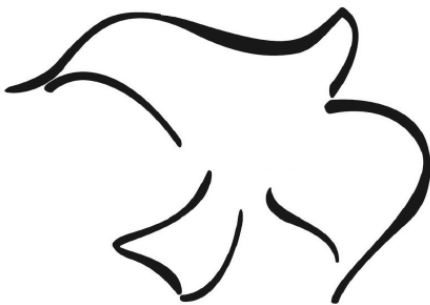


The cross is our salvation and central to our belief of the risen Christ. The three lines that comprise the cross represent the Holy Trinity.



The words are inspired by St. Paul in his Letter to the Hebrews (Heb 13.8), "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." These words were also used by the Catholic Church in its slogan in the year 2000 as the Church entered into the third millennium.



The dove recalls events in the Old Testament (Noah's Ark) and the Descent of the Holy Spirit (New Testament). It represents our story as God's people.



The Alpha and Omega symbol represents the timelessness of Jesus Christ, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." (Rev. 22.13)
