

In addition to being an elite hockey player, Cole is a first-rate individual who possess' so many admirable qualities such as leadership, commitment, respect, selflessness and good judgment. Benny is a role model for his fellow teammates at the Barons' Academy to learn from and follow as he approaches everything he does with 100% conviction and is an outstanding example of "what you put into something is what you will get out of it."

Cole Benson is a 16 year old student that attended Louis St. Laurent for his second semester in grade 10. While there, he became involved in the hockey program. He was drafted by the Edmonton Oil Kings in the 9th round (178th overall) in the 2010 WHL draft and currently is playing there as a 16 year old.

He played for the SSAC BP athletics in his first year of midget hockey when he was 15, tallying up a total of 32 points with 12 goals and 20 assists in 29 games. SSAC went on to play in the MAC's Tournament, one of Midget Hockey's most prestigious tournaments. They won 7 straight games leading them towards a championship title. Shortly afterwards Cole was accepted to play for Team Alberta in the U16 Canada Winter Games. He achieved a point per game average with 7 points in 7 games, helping his team along the way to receive a bronze medal. Upon his return to SSAC, his team made it to the second round of the playoffs and unfortunately was knocked out by Sherwood Park. After the season, Cole was awarded Top Defensive Forward in the League.

"Defense is a critical part of the game. I strive towards being a strong defensive player. It's something that I take pride in. Being a smaller player definitely has its disadvantages from other players on the ice. Playing as a 16 year old in my rookie year in the WHL, it's noticeable the level of play has increased substantially. The players are bigger, stronger, smarter and faster. I don't let it intimidate me being the smallest player on the ice at 5'7 150 lbs. I try to anticipate plays, outsmarting my opponents to put myself into better positions to help me succeed. I just worry about my own game and do my part in helping the team win."

"My parents have been my main contributor to my success, allowing me the opportunities I've experienced and gained up to this point. They're the main reason why I'm where I am today. The hockey program at Louis has been a great help to me as well. Being on the ice nearly every day allowed me to get the practice I needed to hone my skills. I appreciate the time Rick Swan and Larry Draper take out of their days to help work with the academy, making us not only better hockey players, but better individuals as well."
